This is Dexter the dog. He has hurt his paw so will need to have an x-ray.



This is Mike. Mike is a radiographer, which means he's an expert at taking x-rays.



Here it goes...



The x-ray is looked at to see if there are any broken bones (also called a fracture)



This is Gary. He is an orthopaedic practitioner. This means he is an expert at putting on your plaster.



Dexter is being very good at letting Gary put on the plaster, He knows it will make him feel a lot better.



All finished.

This plaster will stay on for a few weeks so the bone can heal. Dexter is a happy puppy again!

## A few weeks later...



This is Lisa. She works with Gary at the hospital. It is time for Dexter to have his plaster removed.



Lisa uses a machine which has a vibrating blade. It makes a loud noise. but Lisa won't hurt you - she's also an expert!

This leaflet has been designed to make the whole plastering process easier to understand. From the first x-ray to the removal of the cast.
