Why is my child in this boot?

This boot is designed to provide a moderate level of support. It is specifically designed for stable fractures of the lower leg, foot and ankle, as well as ankle sprains and post-operative use.

General advice

- Apply a clean sock before wearing the boot and change this daily. This acts as a wick for sweat to try and protect the liner of the boot.
- If your child is allowed to weight bear, ensure they are wearing a supportive shoe on the other foot with a high, flat sole to help bring the foot to the same height as the boot.
- Do not get the boot wet take it off for bathing and showers if you have been told you can.

What is the boot?



Three different colours: Yellow - large Blue - medium Orange - small

The boot has two straps around the leg (three on the large) and two straps around the foot.

These should be tight enough to support the limb.

Two ankle stirrups which go up the sides of the child's ankle which, with the straps, give the limb the support it needs.

The plastic should be removed by the person fitting the boot before leaving the department.



How to fit the boot

- 1) Undo the Velcro straps and open the liner.
- 2) Insert and push the foot into the liner so the foot is at the bottom and back of the boot.
- 3) Wrap the strap around the opposing end to tighten up.

How to remove the boot

- 1) Open all the straps and open up the liner.
- 2) Lift the foot out of the boot.

Washing instructions

We recommend removing the liner and hand washing with mild detergent. Let the liner air dry - do not put into a washing machine or tumble dryer.
