When a baby is lost at whatever stage of pregnancy there are few tangible reminders of their existence. You may feel there is nowhere specific to go and remember your loss, or to place the baby's name.

It may be a comfort for you to know there is a special place.

A Book of Remembrance just for babies is kept in the chapel of the Royal Bournemouth Hospital. You can record the name of your baby in this book, free of charge. If your baby was sadly miscarried, and you do not know its sex, then a surname is sufficient, e.g. Baby Smith.

Once a baby's name is entered, it can be viewed by telephoning the chaplain to arrange a convenient time. This ensures that the book is open at the correct page for you. However, it is always on view in a special glass cabinet, open at the correct month.

We also have a Service of Remembrance for lost babies of any gestational age, this of course, includes babies lost through miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy, stillbirth or lost at any time during the pregnancy. This service is normally held every October, during Babyloss Awareness week. Details can be obtained from the hospital chaplain. The chaplain along with nursing and midwifery staff are available for support as necessary.
