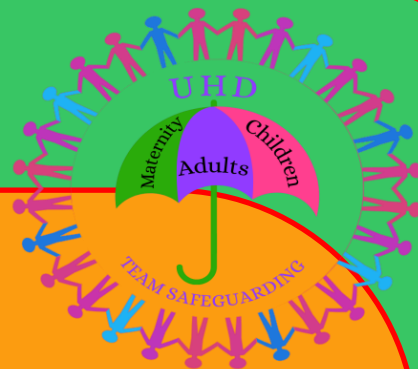

We recognise the challenges of increasing domestic abuse and the exploitation of our children and vulnerable adults. Therefore, we are developing our safeguarding teams, to include adult Learning Disability Nurse and Domestic Abuse Advocates.

Children Safeguarding is protecting children from maltreatment and preventing impairment of children's health or development It involves ensuring that children are growing up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care, enabling optimum life chances and entering adulthood successfully.

Adult Safeguarding is protecting a person's right to live in safety, free from abuse and neglect.
