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...from the Palliative and nd of Life Care Teams across UHD

There's a definite chill in the air and lots of talk about putting the heating on !! The Palliative Care and End of Life teams have been very busy over the past few months as have the wards and departments in the hospital. They have seen has a real increase in the number of patients being referred to the teams and some really great care being delivered at ward level. The team really appreciate all the kindness shown towards our end of life patients and their relatives. Keep up the great work.

The practice educators have been developing the timetable for delivery of end of life education to the end of 2022 and throughout 2023. Alongside mandatory trust training they are delivering training sessions to student nurses, health care support workers, preceptorship staff, registered nurses, volunteers, AHPs, and champions One of the latest sessions was with 20 student nurses learning about delivery of bedside end of life care. They were soaking up the learning and it's great to share knowledge with the future faces of nursing.





The new Bereavement booklet has recently been launched across the site. It has been set out to provide a guide through the processes after the death of loved ones. These booklets are available from the bereavement office on both sites. We would urge all ward areas to ensure any old bereavement packs are now removed and replaced with new stock.

One of the hospital governors, Keith Mitchell, has carried out a survey with the hosts and hostesses at RBCH as part of the ongoing End of Life Care Quality Improvement Project. This project was designed to see what opportunities and barriers there are for hosts & hostesses being able to offer outstanding care for patients on end of life care and their loved ones. The project was also a good opportunity to individually thank the hosts & hostesses for the outstanding work they carry out. Results clearly

show the care and compassion that is being delivered and a love of their jobs. There were some themes that came out on improvement ideas such as training, communication, and environment. These are being looked out and work will begin on these. However there were some great comments made which really do reflect the true worth of the role.
